

## Symposium on Ancestry and Language

The University of Sydney

16-17 May 2019

This 2-day symposium is an event of *The ebb and flow of heritage: Investigating urban multilingual diaspora*, a HKU-USydney Strategic/ Priority Partnership Collaboration project (Umberto Ansaldo and Nicholas Enfield, PIs; Lisa Lim, Co-I), one of whose goals is to further strong and dynamic collaborations between the two institutions. This symposium brings into conversation scholars from Hong Kong and Sydney on the topic of heritage/ migrant/ community/ indigenous languages, drawing on the research and expertise on situations and experiences in both Greater China and Australia. We explore dimensions of, inter alia, migration, migrant languages, minority languages, indigenous languages, language acquisition, education, and language policy, with a central question being how cultural ancestries and linguistic practices are managed, in particular in urban multicultural ecologies.
